

## **EMERGENCY MEETING OF COUNCIL**

**October 11, 2006**

The meeting was called to order by the Warden at 7:02 p.m., in the Conference Room, in the Administrative Centre, in Barrington, N.S., with the following members present:

This Emergency Meeting of Council was convened by the Warden upon unanimous agreement of councillors at their previous meeting held on October 10, 2006. The meeting was called for the purpose of discussing a proposal by Dr. Yee for sponsoring international medical graduates who are coming here next week to be interviewed by him. It was necessary to have the meeting at short notice in order to be prepared for the arrival of these doctors next week who will need to know the circumstances under which they would be recruited to this area, and due to the time constraints imposed by the interview dates.

### CLOSED SESSION

The meeting entered into Closed Session in order to discuss terms of an agreement for the recruitment of physicians to the area.

After much discussion the meeting then returned to Open Session.

It was the general consensus of members that a “meet and greet” will be held for the international medical graduates who are considering moving to this area. These doctors will be visiting the area to be interviewed by Dr. Yee, and to tour the area on Wednesday, October 25, 2006. The Chairperson of the Community Health Care Advisory Committee will be informed of this and will be asked to arrange for a “meet and greet” and tour on that date. Refreshments will be provided for the visiting doctors in the Conference Room, in the Municipal Building.

### MUNICIPAL PROPERTY IN OAK PARK

Members were informed that the Tri-County Regional School Board wishes to begin work on the municipal property in Oak Park, part of which was formerly used as the Oak Park Ball Field. The Tri-County Regional School Board will be moving its bus fueling depot to that location from its former location at the Annex property in Barrington Passage. The Annex property in Barrington Passage will then be returned to the Municipality for disposal. The School Board has requested access to the property in Oak Park in order to begin construction of its bus fueling depot.

**Moved** by S. Strang and seconded by L. Stewart that the Tri-County Regional School Board be authorized to access and work on municipal property in Oak Park for the purpose of creating a bus fueling depot.
