

Subject: July 11, 2012 Fire Service Advisory Committee Meeting
The July meeting of the Municipality of Barrington Fire Service Advisory Committee was held on July 11, 2012 at the Island & BP fire hall.

The meeting was called to order at 7:12 pm by Chairman Dave Kendrick.

Departments present were: Woods Harbour Shag Harbour, Island & BP, Barrington, Port la Tour, and Port Clyde.

Motion made to approve the minutes as read by Jody Goreham, seconded by Paul Thomas, carried.

Motion made by Paul Thomas to take amendment of the Mutual Aid Agreement to the next mutual aid meeting, with an addition added to the amendment penned by Dave Kendrick.

The machine that makes the accountability tags is being repaired in Halifax.

Bernie Kett will be here in August to test and repair the municipal fire trucks.

Motion made by Graham Dixon that helmet colours will be : Chief Officers White, Officers Red, Trained firefighters Black, and Yellow for untrained firefighters that are not allowed inside the building, or hot zone, seconded by Gordon Ross, carried.

Paul Thomas asked that an amendment be added to last months motion on firefighter PPE, it will now read: Motion by Paul Thomas that all firefighters in the municipality shall wear turnout gear, except at medical calls, and firefighters filling SCBA bottles, operating trucks or directing traffic shall wear proper reflective gear,
and at wildland fires, firefighters will wear coveralls.

Discussion on box alarms, it was decided that each Chief would bring in the desired equipment that they would want in the event of a call and

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bring the list into the next meeting. Motion made by Gene Stoddard for Chiefs to bring in a call sheet for dispatch, seconded by Paul Thomas, carried.

New Business:

Discussion on the Fire Co-ordinators position and what tasks need to be accomplished by the co-ordinator.

There was a discussion on SCBA for Port la Tour and Port Clyde, it was decided that if SCBA are purchased then they should be Scott 2.2 since the rest of the municipality uses this type.

Hazmat Awareness & Operations are required for Level 1 & 2 courses and for certification these courses must be done through the fire school.

It was decided that the students would decide if they wanted to be certified or not.

Driver training will be discussed at the next meeting when more information is gathered.
