**FIRST READING – PROPOSED CIVIC ADDRESSING BY-LAW AND PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO BY-LAW NO. 25 – TAX EXEMPTION BY-LAW**

It was noted that an oversight was made last night when dealing with the above referred to by-laws in First Reading. First Reading must be approved by resolution of Council.

**Resolution C170620**

Being duly moved and seconded that the adoption of the proposed Civic Addressing By-law be approved in First Reading.

Motion carried unanimously.

**Resolution C170621**

Being duly moved and seconded that proposed amendments to By-law No. 25 to update properties owned by the Barrington/Port LaTour Fire Department and to add Agape Café Youth Ministry to Schedule “A” be approved in First Reading.

Motion carried unanimously.

Second and Final Reading of both by-laws will be held at future meetings of Council once properly advertised.

**TENDER FOR CONDENSER AT ARENA**

The CAO informed members that tenders have been called for the supply and installation of a condenser at the Sandy Wickens Memorial Arena. Deadline for submissions was earlier today and the following two were received:

- Cimco                      - \$47,930.76 plus hst
- BP Mechanical         - \$47,888.00 plus hst

After careful consideration of both tenders it is the recommendation of the CAO that the tender received from BP Mechanical be accepted, being the lowest tender received.

Resolution C170622

Being duly moved and seconded that Council accept the tender received from BP Mechanical for the supply and installation of a condenser for the Sandy Wickens Memorial Arena, in the amount of \$47,888.00 plus hst.

Motion carried unanimously.

CONCERNS RE: STONEY ISLAND BEACH

The Warden made reference to an email which has been received from a concerned citizen of District 4, Wanda Atkinson, regarding dogs running at large on the Stoney Island Beach as well as people drinking on the beach. Ms. Atkinson also forwarded concerns expressed by others who have experienced problems on the beach. She will be asked to request others to register their complaints with the Municipal Office.

Ms. Atkinson is requesting that a sign be installed in the area similar to what we have posted at the North East Point Beach stating that dogs must be on a leash. During discussion of this matter it was noted that the sign in North East Point is posted on municipal property. The Municipality does not own property in the vicinity of the Stoney Island Beach.

Ms. Atkinson also expressed concern in her email regarding garbage on the beach and “dune riding” which is eroding the dunes.

Resolution C170623

Being duly moved and seconded that a letter be sent to the Department of Natural Resources expressing concerns of residents relating to unleashed dogs, drinking, garbage and dune riding at Stoney Island Beach and that the Municipality request permission to post a sign on DNR property regarding unleashed dogs and people drinking on the beach and that this letter be copied to the Minister and Deputy Minister of Natural Resources, MLA Chris d’Entremont, MLA Zach Churchill, Department of Natural Resources Office in Tusket, RCMP and Wanda Atkinson.

Motion carried unanimously.
