Dear Mr. Nickerson,

Since you are a Warden in the Municipality of Barrington, I hope you might be able to guide me on how to get a World War II small memorial placed at the lighthouse park at Baccaro.

As I stated in my original email sent to Mr. Taylor, 24 Navy WRENS were assigned to this site in the winter of 1944. The buildings they once used are no longer there. But they worked shift duties with their LORAN signalling machine housed in a quonset house. They were given instructions to shoot to kill if any German submarine crews came ashore, and they were also instructed to dynamite their LORAN machine, so the enemy would not have access to it.

I have a copy of the diary with photos from one of these WRENS who worked there. Mary Owen (nee Adamson) is now 96 years old and lives in Perth, ON.

It would be wonderful to have these women officially recognized by having a municipal memorial to their work placed at Baccaro.

If you wish to meet me, I would be pleased to come to Barrington.
