My name is Sydnie Goreham and In March 2020 I and a group of 20 fellow from Nova Scotia will be travelling to Tanzania, Africa to build a school. Or worse yet, imagine that you didn't even know your basic human rights, let alone how to fight for them. For the 121 million primary-aged children who aren't in school, there's no need to imagine this is their painful reality. Without access to an education these children remain voiceless and the cycle of property continues.

Thinking holistically means knowing that everyone and everything is part of a larger system. It means understanding that if we're going to help children break free from poverty, we must first empower their mothers, improve their schools, outfit their health clinics and build water facilities. It means making change sustainable so that children can realize their rights, get heir education and live to their full potential.

Education provides the highest return of any social investment in the developing world. Tri county students can help build schools which will empower children and entire communities to break the cycle of poverty for further generations.

I am asking local businesses to help me be able to visit a village in Tanzania to help build a school and give an education to children who are more than deserving of it.
