

BARRINGTON MUNICIPAL FIRE & EMERGENCY SERVICE

Fire Service Advisory Committee June 11, 2014

The June meeting of the Municipality of Barrington Fire Advisory Committee was held on June 11, 2014 at the Island & BP fire hall.

The meeting was called to order at 7:03 pm by Chairman Dave Kendrick.

TMR-2 information was added to the agenda.

Motion made to approve the agenda by Mike Swim.

Departments present were; Woods Harbour Shag Harbour, Island & BP, Barrington/Port la Tour, and Port Clyde. Councillor Jody Crook was also in attendance.

There was a discussion on the revision of the GOG's. Dave Kendrick explained that there will be one complete document now instead of the old system.

The previous month's minutes were read, and a motion for approval was made by Paul Thomas, seconded by Jason Shand, carried.

Old Business:

There was a discussion on firefighter plates. It was decided that the matter would be taken to the next mutual aid meeting, where it would be forwarded to the FSANS.

Discussion on having the Municipality of Barrington pay for the cost of crests to go on all fire apparatus in the Municipality.

New Business:

There will be a class 3 course in Port Clyde next week.

The 8 year exam and skills will start on June 11 for interior firefighters.

There was a lengthy discussion on the MBU and who will be taking the courses.

Reports should be done for all calls, including MFR calls and sent to the fire marshal's office.

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Motion made by Troy Perry to have 2 station Chiefs for Barrington/Port la Tour, with the first Station Chief on scene having jurisdiction. Motion seconded by Jason Shand, carried, one against.

Vehicle identification for the new TMR-2 must be completed by Friday June 13, also the number of portables has been reduced from 7 to 6. (Should read Mobiles instead of Portable)

Motion made by Brian Crowell that departments would be able to put the municipal fire crest on their trucks where they would like, and would be able to keep their own crests where they would like on their trucks. The crests will be a minimum of 16 inches. Motion seconded by Mike Swim, carried, one against.

There was a lengthy discussion on truck replacement, it was thought that this subject should be taken back to the individual departments for discussion.

Port Clyde brought their application for the emergency service providers fund for revision. Motion made by Brian Crowell for the FSAC to accept the Port Clyde emergency service providers fund application, seconded by Jason Shand, carried.

Motion made to adjourn by Paul Thomas.
